Participant 1:

Female, 26— Centennial Park, AZ

Occupation: Mortgage Servicing Supervisor

Me: Do you use Spotify?

Participant: Yes..

Me: Do you have Spotify premium?

Participant: Yes..

Me: How often do you use Spotify?

Participant: Daily.

Me: How often do you listen to music?

Participant: Daily.

Me: How do you typically discover new music?

Participant: Uh, through the radio function, you know at the bottom? Where they suggest new songs.

Me: Like when you start listening to a radio playlist based on an individual song?

Participant: So when you are listening to a playlist, when the playlist runs out of songs there are suggested songs at the bottom that you can listen to.

Me: Ohh, I know what you mean. Okay awesome. So tell me about the last time someone shared music with you.

Participant: Um, well because Spotify doesn't have the music sharing any more you have to do it through Imessage or something which sucks because then you have to go look up the song.

Me: What do you mean by looking it up?

Participant: Either people send you screenshots of a song, or they will send a Spotify link. The link doesn't always work, like you click on it and it won't take you directly to the Spotify app and open it. So you have to go into the app, type in the song and find it that way.

Me: I see what you mean. That sounds frustrating. Can you recall a good experience you had while someone shared music with you?

Participant: It was with you actually.

Me: Tell me more about that.

Participant: I mean, you know me and you know what kind of music I like *laughs.* So I'd say it was a good experience because you were sharing music with me that you knew I would enjoy.

Me: I do have great taste in music *laughs.* So tell me about the last time you shared music with someone else.

Participant: I just sent a Spotify link through imessage.

Me: What was good about that experience?

Participant: Probably just the feedback I received about the music.

Me: Can you recall a frustrating experience you had while sharing music with someone else?

Participant: I mean the only thing I would say that that sucks is that you can't talk through the application. You have to use other applications to share.

Me: Yeah I completely agree. I guess Spotify deleted the feature back in 2017 due to low engagement but it seems to be a common frustration. Well, last two questions-- first being, tell me about a good experience you had while using Spotify?

Participant: I like that Spotify will suggest new music based on what you listen to.

Me: Can you elaborate on that?

Participant: I just like that they offer songs or playlists to you based on what you listen to. It makes it so that I can discover more music rather than listening to the same playlists or songs over and over again.

Me: Tell me about a frustrating experience you had while using Spotify.

Participant: Uh, the only thing I can think of are good things right now.

Me: You can share more good things that's totally fine.

Participant: Well they have the driving feature. The features in the app get bigger while you're driving so it's easier to use. They also have the feature if you lose service Spotify will automatically have 3 songs downloaded so that you can keep listening to music even though you lose service.

Me: That's awesome I didn't know they did that. Sweet! Well that sums up the interview. Thank you for taking the time to help me out, I really appreciate it.

Participant 2:

Female, 33— Santa Rosa, CA Occupation: Graphic Designer

Me: Do you use Spotify?

Participant: Yes.

Me: Do you have Spotify Premium?

Participant: Yes. .

Me: How often do you use Spotify?

Participant: Everyday.

Me: How often do you listen to music?

Participant: Everyday.

Me: How do you typically discover new music?

Participant: Um, I feel like I don't discover new music that often. I have like 6 playlists I listen to and that's it. Participant: Um, David sent me a Spotify link through text.

Me: Can you recall a good experience you had while someone shared music with you? Or maybe a frustrating experience?

Participant: Most they are really good experiences because they are awesome songs. Um, there's a lot of times where it's frustrating because for some reason, my phone won't open the link in the app. So I can't like, immediately add it to a playlist. I have to open the app, search the song myself and then go add it to my playlist.

Me: Tell me about the last time you shared music with someone else?

Participant: Um, it was not too long ago. I found a song I liked and I texted the link to David.

Me: What was good about that experience?

Participant: It's usually a good experience when I get a response from the other person saying that they like the song I shared.

Me: Can you recall a frustrating experience?

Participant: This might sound kind of dumb but it sucks when it gets to the end of the day and you haven't heard back from the other person about the song you sent. Like with David, I'll ask what he thought about the song and he will tell me he hadn't listened to it yet.

Me: Do you use Spotify?

Participant: Yes.

Me: Do you have Spotify Premium?

Me: How often do you listen to music?

Participant: Everyday.

Me: How do you typically discover new music?

Participant: Through my Discover Weekly playlist.

Participant: Someone sent me a Spotify link through text message. I wish Spotify still had the message section versus texting because my message box was a full playlist of its own. Participant 4:

Male, 31— Centennial Park, AZ Occupation: Dr. Patient Liaison

Me: Do you use Spotify?

Participant: Yes.

Me: Do you have Spotify Premium?

Participant: Yes.

Me: How often do you use Spotify?

Participant: Daily.

Me: How often do you listen to music?

Participant: Daily.

Me: How do you typically discover new music?

Participant: There are a couple of Spotify playlists I use to discover new music. Either by genre or the Discover weekly playlist.

Participant 5:

Male, 28— Centennial Park, AZ Occupation: Loan Officer

Me: Do you use Spotify?

Participant: Yes.

Me: Do you use Spotify Premium?

Participant: Yes.

Me: How often do you use Spotify?

Participant: Pretty much every day.

Me: How often do you listen to music.

Participant: Everyday.
